

## **HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY**

- Health & Safety awareness and the responsibility to look after oneself and those with whom we pursue our activities is the responsibility of each individual.
- Every individual should ensure that all areas of the club, particularly the areas most frequented by visitors and members, are kept in a safe condition.
- Any matters which have Health & Safety implications should be noted in the Sailing Log (located in the Race Box) and reported to the Committee.
- First Aid provisions are kept in the First Aid cupboard (located: in the Disabled Toilet).
- A list of First Aiders is displayed alongside/on the First Aid cupboard.
- Members should report to the race officer any disabilities they have or if they are receiving medication, especially when out sailing.
- There must always be two safety boats available with personnel ready to crew them during periods of organised sailing by the club.
- Risk assessments should be carried out of the clubs activities and facilities at the beginning of each sailing season and reviewed annually and when activities or facilities change.
  - The purpose of risk assessments are to identify hazards and evaluate risks arising from them, in order to establish the necessary preventative measures.
- Risk Assessment evaluation should be placed on the agenda of the Sailing Committee meeting, once the sailing programme has been drafted for the forthcoming season.
- Fire exits, extinguishers and signs should be visible and kept clear of obstructions at all times.
- Fire extinguishers, electrical sockets, smoke/heat detectors and combi-boiler are professionally inspected yearly.
