

LSC Youth RS Fevas

Booking – **Adult members** will be asked for a fee of **£5** per session (morning or afternoon). This is not applicable to members in categories Junior, Students or Young Adults.

- Booking out one of the Fevas is easy but remember that the boats cannot be used above a F4.
- Write your names down in the appropriate section on the booking sheet. You can either have the AM session (any time before lunch break) or the PM session. Make sure a committee member countersigns the booking before going afloat.
- You can only book for one session in a day (AM or PM).
- If you are paying a fee, please leave the money in the tin in the canteen.
- You can book up to one week in advance. Please remember to cancel it if you change your mind.
- Please be considerate, if you took it out the week before and someone else wants a go, please stand aside. Equally, if no one is taking the boats out, go for it, they are there to be used!
- **The Fevas are youth boats so the priorities are: 13-19 years-old, then adult with a child. Finally, two adults if no one else has booked the boat.**
- If you have booked a Feva out and are unsure how you will cope in the wind strength, it is probably a good idea not to go. Any committee member can tell you that you are not to take the boat out if they feel that you might not be able to cope.

Rigging

- The RS Fevas are kept in the far compound
- Sails, daggerboard and rudder are kept in a cupboard in the annexe. Make sure that you use the right equipment for the right boat.
- The key for the cupboard is kept in the canteen and you must ask a committee member to use it.
- If you are not sure how to rig the boat come and find Gary, Mark or Anna who will show you or point you in the direction of someone who can help.
- Once you have landed, wash the boat down. This includes the hull, sails if salty, blocks, trolley, etc.
- Return the sails, daggerboard and rudder to the storage area in the annexe hut, ensure that the cupboard is locked and return the key.
- Return the boat to its appropriate space and put the cover on, also ensure that the boat is tied down safely.
- If you are unsure about anything you can come and find any committee member; they are all willing to help with any queries.
- It is your responsibility to make sure that the boat is put away after sailing.
- If no one has booked the boat out for the afternoon, put it away. Other sailors can always get it out again for the afternoon.
- If any accidental damage is sustained, don't be embarrassed (that is what insurance is for!) however we do need to know, under the booking space there is a box labelled 'Damage', just write down whatever has broken so that we can address it.
